FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What time is check in & check out? Check in time is 12:00 hours, Check out time is 10:00 hours

Where is the Fire Assembly Point? In the event of an fire or emergency incident all visitors must gather at the main area opposite reception

What are the opening times of the campsite reception? Reception is open every day from 9.00am to 5.00pm For out of hours emergencies our Wardens can be found next to the main entrance.

What times do the campsite gates open and close? The gates open every day at 7:30am and close at 08:30pm.

What is the speed limit at the Park?

The speed limit is 5mph on the campsite. Please be aware of children, cyclists and animals.

Where can I allow my children to play safely?

Children can play safely within the boundary of the campsite. Please do not let children play outside the campsite gate.

When can I allow my dog off the lead?

Dogs are very welcome at Oak View but please keep dogs on leads at all times and collect & dispose of their waste correctly. Dogs are permitted to be off the lead when you are in the forest but not when you're around the animals.

What is the post code for New Park

Park Rules

For your safety and the safety of all our guests using the Park we would ask you to observe the following rules:

- Observe a 5-mph speed limit during all times of the day
- Be aware of children playing games or riding bikes
- The park operates a One-Way system on our roads, please only follow the White arrows in a clockwise direction. Priority must be given to pedestrians and their pets
- No Ball games are allowed anywhere in the park
- Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times
- Dog fouling must be cleared using disposable bags and deposited in the bins provided
- All rubbished must be bagged and deposited in the bins provided. No rubbish is to be left on your pitch on departure
- You must take large items of rubbish away with you i.e. broken, tents, cardboard, chairs etc. Only general food waste and packaging is to be disposed of in our bins. You may be liable to a £40 charge if we end up having to dispose of bulky items
- Please always keep noise levels to a minimum and respect you fellow campers
- The use of Barbecues is permitted, disposable barbecues must be raised off the ground before lighting

- Barbecues must not be left unattended at any time; HOT remains MUST not be placed in rubbish bins until the following morning when completely cool and place in a suitable plastic bag
- In the event of a fire, Raise the Alarm, Go straight to the: - Fire Assembly Point – Main Area Opposite Reception
- All site pitches are based on 6m(across) by 8m (depth)
- Any accidents at Oak View Holiday Park must be reported at the reception or a member of staff. All accidents will be entered into Our Accident Book
- Drunk, disorderly, or abusive behaviour will not be tolerated. We reserve the right to ask you to leave should this occur
- We cannot accept responsibility for your possessions or any personal injury of any kind
- No fireworks, Chinese lanterns
- We reserve the right of admission. We only accept responsible campers that are considerate to fellow campers/guests and be respectful of the environment.
- We operate a no smoking policy when entering facilities within the Park
- Please ensure cigarette butts are disposed of correctly and placed in the waste bins provided. Thank you for your co-operation
